##### Bailli Délégué du Canada

"Chief executive Officer" of the Chaine in Canada

##### Bailli Regional

Chair of the Local Council

***Gold medal and chain on green ribbon***



##### National Council Officer

Any of National Council Chancellor, Argentier, Conseiller Culinaire, Conseiller Gastronomique, Chargé(e) de Missions, Chargé(e) de Presse

***Gold medal and chain on blue ribbon edged in gold braid***



##### Local Council Officer

Any of Local Council Vice-Chancellor, Vice-Argentier, Vice-Conseiller Culinaire, Conseiller Gastronomique, Vice-Chargé(e) de Vice-Missions, Vice-Chargé(e) de Presse

***Gold medal and chain on blue ribbon***



##### National Echanson

Member of the National Council and National Chairperson of L'Ordre Mondial des Gourmets Dégustateurs.

***Gold tastevin and chain on blue ribbon with a burgundy stripe and thin orange stripe in the middle, edged with gold braid***



##### Local Vice-Echanson

Member of the Local Council and Chairperson of the local chapter of L'Ordre Mondial des Gourmets Dégustateurs.

***Gold tastevin and chain on blue ribbon with a wide orange stripe and a burgundy stripe in the middle***

## Members at Large



### Rôtisseur

The initial Chaîne Professional grade. Reserved for a young Chef.

**Silver medal and chain on orange ribbon and Rôtisseur insignia**



### Chef de Table

Maitre d'Hôtel, Chef de Rang, Restaurant Service Educator who cooks at the table, if need be

**Silver medal and chain on purple ribbon with orange stripe**



### Chef Rôtisseur

Sous Chef, Chef de partie, Culinary Educator.

**Silver medal and chain on orange ribbon with one red stripe and Rôtisseur insignia**



### Maître Restaurateur; Maître Hôtelier; Maître Sommelier.

Owner/manager or director or head of an establishment or service. A Service Programme Educator.

**Silver medal and chain on purple ribbon with orange stripe, edged in light blue, with appropriate insignia.**



### Maître Rôtisseur

Owner, Director, Manager, Head Chef, Culinary Program Director involved in the running of the kitchen at a catering establishment.

**Silver medal and chain on orange ribbon with two red stripes and Rôtisseur insignia**



### Sommelier

Sommelier or Chef de Cave, Wine Educator.

**Silver medal and chain on purple ribbon with orange stripe and bottle and glass insignia**



### Professionnel de la Table

A person directly involved in restaurant service.

**Silver medal and chain on purple ribbon with place setting insignia**



### Professionnel du Vin

A person directly involved in viticulture, including an owner, director, manager, of a vineyard and/or a winery, a winemaker, an owner/manager of an wine boutique.

**Silver medal and chain on purple ribbon with orange stripe, edged in light blue and grape insignia (not shown)**

## **Chevalier / Dame de la Chaîne**

The initial non-professional Chaîne grades.

*Silver medal and chain on purple ribbon edged in light blue*



## **Officier**

Promotion for a Chevalier or a Dame de la Chaîne. Also for a special member, or Président of an Association to be honoured.

*Gold medal and chain on purple ribbon edged in red*

# Commandeur Membership Awards



A silver or gold coloured pin is awarded to recognize various annual membership milestones in the Chaîne des Rôtisseurs. This pin is worn on the ribbon of the member so recognized.

**Commandeur (Silver)** - 10 years of continuous membership

**Commandeur (Gold)** - 20 years of continuous membership

**Officier Commandeur (Gold)** - 30 years of membership

**Grand Commandeur (Gold)** - 40 years of membership

**Officier Grand Commandeur (Gold)** - 50 years membership

**Haut Commandeur (Gold)** - 60 years of membership
